

SPOTLIGHT: Teacher Mini-Grant Recipient

“Shhh! Don’t scare the chicks!” is not the usual warning that you would find on a classroom door but thanks to a grant from FMFCU Foundation, some Delaware County students are learning more about Embryology- a 21 day incubation program for students to see the full development of a chick through candling from start to finish. They cared for eggs, tracked chick development and watched them hatch!

Colleen DiMaggio, gifted teacher in the Southeast Delco School District, learned about the Foundation’s latest round of Teacher Mini-Grants and was quick to jump on the opportunity to apply because she knew the program would be something her students “would always remember.” Thanks to Ms. DiMaggio’s efforts, students throughout her district have experienced this unique program first hand.

SPOTLIGHT: Excellence in Teaching Award Grants

Cheryl McLauchlan teacher at **The Episcopal Academy** used the Excellence in Teaching grant money for a College Readiness Program for high school seniors. They became certified in CPR; built bookshelves to learn how to use tools; made bookmarks to learn how to sew, took yoga for relaxation, and made first aid kits for college.



Amy Stilley, teacher at **Sharon Hill School** used the funds to update the classroom library with both books and virtual subscriptions. The books purchased covered a range of reading levels and the new technology increased engagement.

Debra Thomas, teacher at **Linwood Elementary School** attended a STEM workshop to advance her knowledge as a teacher. The lesson suggested books based on grade level, which Debra purchased for her classroom so she can implement her new lessons.


